Les **Denend** wrote: "Following a short but very nicely done ceremony (the flowers we are holding were from the ceremony) to honor all veterans visiting that day, the five of us and spouses spread out to pay private respects and come to grips with the impact of the nearly ten thousand markers of the American soldiers buried there. Later we visited Omaha Beach. We all walked down to the water — it was about mid-tide similar to the conditions on D-day — and looked back at the imposing cliffs just behind the beach. I walked 221 steps from the water's edge to the beginning of the upslope to the cliffs, a very tough assignment I thought under fire."

After attending the Blackbird reunion held in Reno back in June Jim **Wilson** did some reflection on memories and challenges faced when he wrote "You may or may not recall that I was selected for the SR-71 program in mid 1972 and checked out in the spring of 1973 at Beale AFB. On the occasion of my first Mach 3 flight in Feb 1973 I was presented with a Mach 3 pin by the 9th SRW Vice Wing Commander Colonel Pat Halloran. The much cherished pin is given by Lockheed Aircraft Corp in the name of the SR designer Kelly Johnson. Per SOP my family was invited to attend the short presentation...lots of smiles and happiness but no speeches. I've proudly worn that pin on my lapel for 42 years while attending many memorable events. It is

irreplaceable. That fact is well known from the start. Don't lose it. You only get one and they

can't be purchased."
